





Covid-19 Outbreak Contingency Plan for Parents: September 2021

<p>When should my child self-isolate or miss school?</p>  <p>STAY AT HOME</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All children MUST attend school unless they have Covid symptoms, are ill, or have tested positive for Covid. • From 16th August 2021, children under 18 (or double-vaccinated adults) do not need to self-isolate or miss school if a member of their household or a contact has tested positive for Covid. • Instead, they will need to book a PCR test but can continue coming to school so long as they have no symptoms whilst awaiting the result of the test.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If your child develops Covid symptoms at home, they should stay at home and should book a PCR test, NOT a Lateral Flow test. • If your child develops Covid symptoms at school, they will be sent home and you should book them a PCR test. • If your child tests positive for Covid, they will need to self-isolate. The rest of the household does not need to self-isolate if they are under 18 or fully vaccinated – but instead should book a PCR test.

<p>Low Community Transmission. No school cases.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There have been no cases of Covid within school for 10 school days. • Cases of Covid locally are low and/ or stable. 	<p>Measures outlined in COVID Risk assessment, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Promotion of good hygiene: hand and respiratory (staff and children). • Thorough cleaning arrangements. • Well ventilated classrooms. • Ensuring children / staff stay at home if they have Covid Symptoms (and to book a PCR test). • Staff will continue to test themselves using Lateral flow tests until the end of September when this will be reviewed by the Government. • Parents encouraged to wear masks when collecting/dropping off children unless exempt. • Visitors in school may be asked to wear masks unless exempt.
<p>Rising Community Transmission. No school cases.</p>	<p>No current Covid cases have been recorded at school, but...</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cases of Covid are rising rapidly in the community causing disruption to other local schools. • Oxfordshire Public Health / Public Health England issue warnings of expected local/ national infection wave 	<p>Additional contingency measures:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ventilation of classrooms increased (if possible) & handwashing supervised. • More outdoor learning (where possible). • Restrictions on parents and visitors in school • Clinically Vulnerable staff meet with Headteacher to discuss additional protection (e.g., use of face coverings, reduction in movement between classes/ groups).

Community Covid Risk – Number of cases	Description	Actions
<p>A single child tests positive</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A single child tests positive for Covid in a class. • There are fewer than 5 cases in a class. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The child self-isolates for 10 days. Remote learning will be provided if they are well enough to complete it in line with school's Remote Learning Policy. • The parents of the child are contacted directly by NHS Track and Trace to establish likely contacts. • Likely contacts will be contacted by NHS Track & Trace and advised to book at PCR Test. • Children do not need to miss school or self-isolate whilst they wait for the result of the PCR test unless they have Covid Symptoms.
<p>5 children or staff within a class test positive within 10 days of each other.</p> <p><u>OR</u></p> <p>10% of children or staff in a class test positive within 10 days of each other.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There have been 5 cases of Covid across a year group within 10 days which could mean that Covid is spreading within that group of children. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • As above for each positive case. • The school will discuss the outbreak with Oxfordshire Public Health and agree strengthening protective measures <u>for 10 school days</u>, including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Re-introducing staff face coverings for corridors & communal areas. ○ Restricting pupils mixing between classes ○ One-off enhanced cleaning focussing on touch points and any shared equipment. ○ Adapting, limiting, or postponing indoor sporting events, trips, open days and performances. ○ Reverting to assemblies in classrooms. ○ Reducing the number of classes staff work across. ○ Resuming twice-weekly Staff Lateral flow testing if these have stopped.
<p>Covid cases continue to increase rapidly within a 10-day period.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Despite the measures indicated above, Covid cases within the school continue to rise within a 10-day period with multiple classes and staff affected, suggesting that Covid is spreading widely throughout the school. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Incident Management Team meeting held between the school and Oxfordshire Public Health to agree further measures, for a further 10 school days, including possibly: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Re-introducing class bubbles. ○ Reverting to class-based school lunches. ○ Limiting all non-essential visitors to school. ○ Postponing all non-essential events. ○ Re-introducing remote learning for individual classes for 10 school days considered, in line with Remote Learning Policy.

The school will inform parents of any changes to Covid measures should these be needed.
